


Faculty Review of Open eTextbooks



- The ratings provided throughout are based on my review of this material for use as a primary text in a Child Development course (not a course on Social and Personality Development, for which this module might be better suited, or as a chapter in a course on Child Development). The text does not cover developmental concepts outside of social and personality development or provide relevant examples of other developmental phenomena that would be featured in an introductory Child Development course.
- The reviewed content is listed as a module on the NOBA website and is not a full-length textbook.
- The module includes descriptions of key terms but would benefit from description of conducted studies.
 Because the module is quite brief, limited attention is devoted to various aspects of social and personality development (whereas more attention would be provided to these issues in a full-length textbook). The module focuses on some of the most salient topics that would be covered in a course on Social and Personality Development.

- The module focuses on social and personality development and could be included in a course on Child Development as the reading or as supplemental reading for that section.
- Of note, however, is that there are a number of NOBA modules available online relevant to a course on various topics in developmental psychology that could likely be pieced together for use in a Child Development course.

What areas of this textbook require improvement in order for it to be used in your courses?

The module is brief and focuses exclusively on social and personality development; other aspects of developmental psychology would have to be included as well for this material to be used as a primary text in a Child Development course.
